INTRODUCTION

The UniCredit Youth America's Cup and the inaugural Puig Women's America's Cup are two events of the Louis Vuitton 37th America's Cup Barcelona schedule that promise to deliver some of the most competitive and compelling racing whilst lighting an exciting pathway for the next generation of foiling sailing stars. Combining both fleet racing and one-on-one match-racing to decide the winners in each category, the organisers have scheduled the Final races to ensure maximum publicity.

The UniCredit Youth America's Cup Final will see the top two boats race between races of the Louis Vuitton Cup Final on the 26th September 2024 where the cream of Youth sailors from all around the world will race in fully equalised AC40s which, since launch in late 2022, have been a sensation. Named as World Sailing's 'Boat of the Year' in 2023, its pedigree shone at the first two America's Cup Preliminary Regattas in Vilanova i la Geltrú, Spain, and Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. What was delivered by the 'works' teams of the America's Cup was some of the closest and most dynamic racing ever seen in the world of sailing with eye-watering closing and outright speeds.

However, the main reason for the introduction of the AC40 has been to provide a pathway for both Women and Youth (under 25) into the America's Cup and the yachts will be used for both the re-introduced UniCredit Youth America's Cup and the inaugural Puig Women's

America's Cup. The format for these events will feature twelve teams, split into separate six-boat fleets for an initial series to decide the top four in each fleet to progress to a match-race semi-final before the top two boats duke it out with the media spotlight firmly on them in the respective Finals.

TIMELINE

WHEN: SEPTEMBER TO OCTOBER 2024

The format for both the UniCredit Youth America's Cup and the Puig Women's America's Cup is intense with up to five days of on-water race training before the fleet race series starts in each division. The fleet of twelve teams is split between the invited teams and the Louis Vuitton 37th America's Cup teams.

The Qualification Series sees a total of eight races completed for both groups. The top three teams from each group progress into a Final Series of four races to

decide the top two teams that will go head-to-head in a winner-takes-all Final Match Race. Racing starts at 14:00 CEST on race days (times might adjust slightly on the days that coincide with Louis Vuitton Cup racing), and runs until 16:00 or 17:00 CEST, depending on the race schedule.

CATALONIA, SPAIN

WHERE: BARCELONA, PORT OLÍMPIC

The AC40 fleets for the UniCredit Youth and Puig Women's America's Cup events will be based along the Barcelona waterfront at the re-developed Port Olímpic to allow fans and spectators the rare opportunity to get up close to the AC40 racing yachts and engage with the athletes.

Barcelona's Port Olímpic was built in 1990 to host the 1992 Olympic Games' sailing competitions and has recently undergone an exciting and ambitious renovation. The new Port Olímpic has been designed to be integrated into Barcelona's new maritime profile. Surrounded by two of the city's most important urban beaches, Somorrostro and Nova Icària, it faces the Olympic Village, today a dynamic residential neighbourhood, and is delimited by some of 1990s

Barcelona's architectural icons: the Torre Mapfre, the Hotel Arts and the sinuous profile of Frank Gehry's statue. Work is being completed to transform the Port Olímpic into a space dedicated to city residents. A revamped area where the blue economy, boating, food and the sea will become the heart of economic and social activity as well as being a focus for the UniCredit Youth America's Cup and the inaugural Puig Women's America's Cup from September to October 2024.

Racing will take place just metres off the beach in Barcelona with its natural viewing opportunities all along the extensive beachfront and racing will be a real spectacle with both fleet and match-racing (one-on-one) for the spectators to enjoy. •

THE PATH TO THE UNICREDIT YOUTH AMERICA'S CUP

EVENT FORMAT

The UniCredit Youth America's Cup is scheduled to run from the 10th to the 26th September with a total of six scheduled days of practice that run from the 10th to the 16th September so that all the teams can get vital time on the water in a racing capacity.

The fleet of twelve teams will be split between the Invited Teams and the Louis Vuitton 37th America's Cup Teams with the competition starting in earnest on the 17th September. Eight fleet races are scheduled for each group to determine the top three rankings that will then move forward to the Semi-Final stage of the UniCredit Youth America's Cup.

The Semi-Final, scheduled for Sunday 22nd September is where the pressure comes on with just one day of intense fleet racing amongst the top six teams. Four races are planned to determine the top two boats who will make it through to the Final where the format switches to match-racing (one-on-one) and is scheduled to take place on the opening day of the Louis Vuitton Cup Final series. For that one race, it is certainly the highest pressure any of the young athletes will ever have faced, with a winner-takes-all race with no margin for error and all under the most intense publicity with the race being screened free-to-air around the world.

The winner of the UniCredit Youth America's Cup will be the team that can master big fleet foiling racing and then have the ability to switch into match-racing mode with a whole different mindset and playbook. It is the ultimate test to find the greatest young foiling athletes on the planet with the winner claiming the fabulous, bespoke, UniCredit Youth America's Cup

Trophy that resembles a bowline knot. The stars of the future, those that will write their names in the history of the America's Cup, will all be on display. Don't miss it.

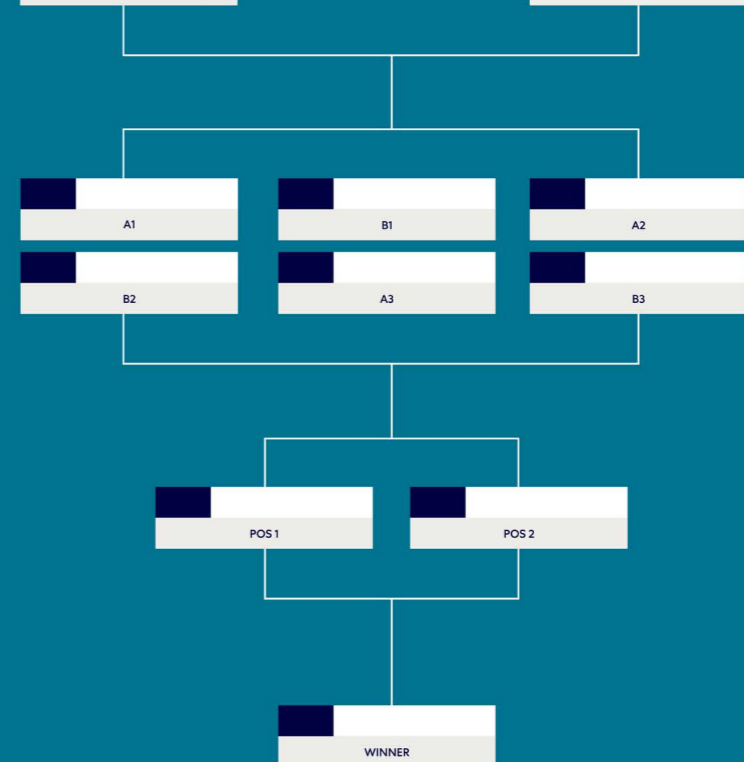

THE WORLD'S COOLEST NEW FOILING BOAT

THE BOAT: AC40 

The AC40 is the designated boat for the UniCredit Youth America's Cup that will take place in Barcelona in 2024 and usher through to the top echelons of high-performance sailing, the next generation of foiling superstars.

At the World Sailing Awards in Málaga, the AC40 was named as the 2023 winner of the Boat of the Year—'presented to mark outstanding boat design, innovative concepts and ground-breaking technological advancements that are changing the face of sailing and pioneering change across the world.'

World Sailing described the AC40 as: "A highly innovative and technologically advanced sailing yacht. It is designed to bring America's Cup foiling performance to competitive racing, featuring self-tacking headsails and an autopilot control system that maintains stable flight. It incorporates advanced hydraulics, electric assistance, and onboard electronic systems to control various aspects of the yacht, such as foil arms, sail control, and flight stability."

Grant Dalton, CEO of America's Cup Events, has been impressed with the boat and its potential for creating the next generation of sailing stars, saying: "The AC40 opens the pathway for Youth sailors into the big league of the America's Cup and with twelve teams forming, training and getting the buzz for high performance sailing, the AC40 couldn't have been a better platform to deliver on our goals with the America's Cup and its future. Undoubtedly the most exciting foiling class to come to the mainstream, the AC40 is re-defining sailing at the top end of the sport

and we look forward to supporting the UniCredit Youth America's Cup with incredible coverage of the Final match-race in between races for the Louis Vuitton Cup in September."

The fleet of AC40s have all been built by McConaghy's in China whilst the foils and onboard systems have been delivered by the Emirates Team New Zealand North Shore Facility. The teams of the Louis Vuitton 37th America's Cup have been able to modify and test out componentry on the AC40 throughout their training, and for this purpose, they were deemed as LEQ12 (less-than-or-equal-to-12-metres in length) boats, but for competition purposes in the UniCredit Youth America's Cup, they will be returned to one-design according to strict rules that govern the event to make every boat as equal as possible and ensure that the best youth athletes win.

KEY FEATURES OF THE AC40:

- **ALL UP** The hull length is 11.3 metres with a 3.38 metre beam and an 18 metre mast. The boat has an all-up weight of just 2 tons and is sailed by a crew of four comprising two helms and two trimmers. There is no requirement for power as it is all battery operated. In light winds the AC40 is expected to be able to sail at up to 26 knots at 46° upwind and 30 knots boat speed at 138° downwind. At the upper limits of 20 knots TWS, the boat speeds are expected to escalate to 39 knots upwind at 41° and 44 knots at an angle of 155° downwind.
- **HYDRAULICS** Hydraulics are at the heart of the AC40 control systems, with most hardware being operated by electrically assisted hydraulics, supplied by Cariboni. Controls include: Foil arms, autopilot control, all sail controls and mast rotation. These are all operable using a push button control system, whilst sitting at either the helm or crew positions.
- **FOILS** Each AC40 is supplied ready to sail, with two foil arms, wings and flaps and the T-foil rudder blade. The foil arm is a carbon composite construction with the foil wings and flaps a mixture of carbon and stainless steel for strength and durability. The foil arms connect to two bearing points, one on the hull and the other onto the hydraulic rams directly to control overall foil position. The T-foil rudder is a carbon/steel construction, with a solid wing fixed into a stock and hull mounting at deck level.
- **ELECTRONICS** One of the key points with the new AC40 is the reliance on battery power versus manpower, so gone are the days of requiring a small army of crew. Each boat is provided with a lithium battery pack and the required charging unit and power reserves are designed to last around 8 hours, so even a long day's racing is more

than taken care of. Power is used to accumulate hydraulic pressure and operates the boat's PLC (Programmable Logic Controller) unit which handles all sail, board and mast controls.

- **MAST AND RIGGING** Provided by Southern Spars, the rig on the AC40 is a high-modulus D Section spar, which flies two mainsail skins simultaneously. Coupled with internal composite battens it allows sail camber and twist to be manipulated far more than a conventional sail. A single boom is fitted inside the two skins which allows for mainsheet attachment, traveller attachment and outhaul control. The mast is built in two sections that allows for easy break-down when shipping/trucking the AC40.

- **SAIL PLAN** The AC40 has a standardised one-design sail inventory, consisting of five sails—two mainsail skins and three headsails. Class sails are provided with North Sails using a mixture of C-Tech and custom-built hardware.

- **SAIL AREAS** Mainsail: 63 m², J1: 38m², J2: 32m², and J3: 26m².

WHO IS RACING

For the UniCredit Youth and Puig Women's America's Cup, aside from the six confirmed entries from the America's Cup competitors, yacht clubs from around the world were invited to form teams with strong and experienced women and youth athlete divisions eyeing these AC40 events as the ultimate pathway to the apex of sailing—the America's Cup. They have already attracted the next generation, the foiling generation, and teams are busy practising on specially built simulators and programmes, readying themselves for what promises to be some of the closest fought battles of the summer in 2024. For certain, future winners, and legends of the America's Cup will announce themselves to the world at the UniCredit Youth and Puig Women's America's Cup. •

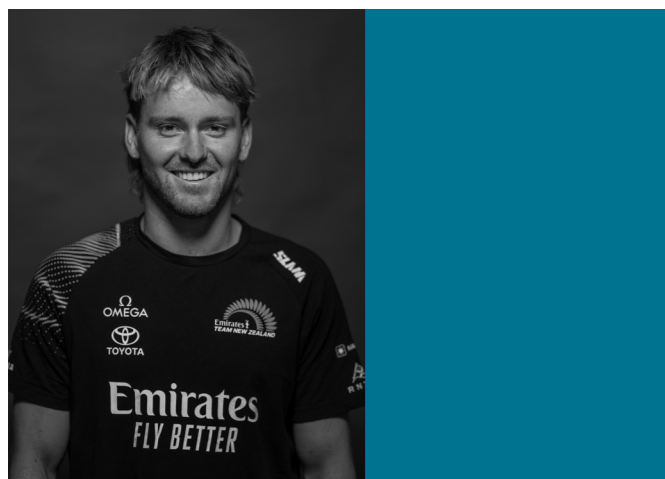

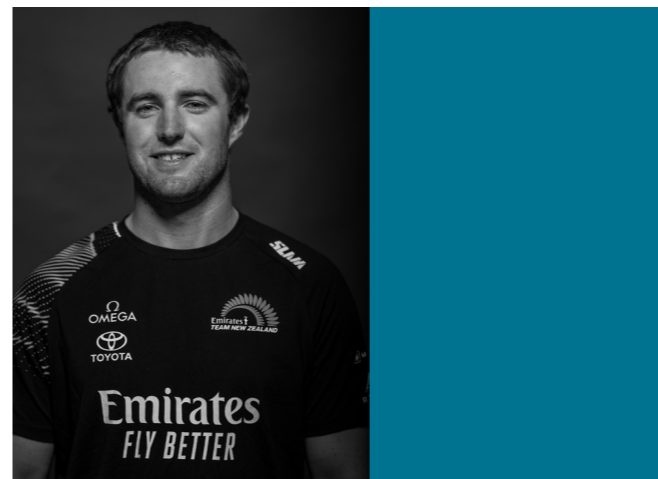

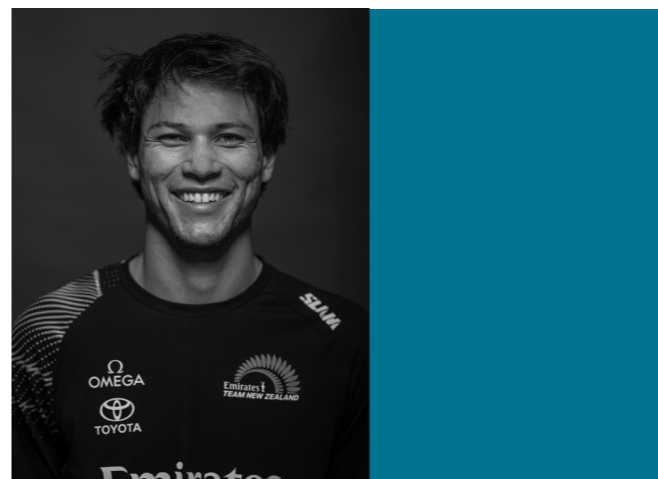

Athena Pathway was launched in August 2022 by Hannah Mills and Sir Ben Ainslie, the world's most successful Olympic sailors, with the aim of fast-tracking development in high-performance sailing and bringing diversity into the sport and the UK marine industry more broadly. The Puig Women's and Youth America's Cups are a central focus for the Pathway, with the first-time inclusion of a women's event and the renewed emphasis on supporting the next generation representing major progress for the World's oldest sporting trophy in achieving gender equity and raising the sport's profile for young people.

Over 300 applications were received for Athena Pathway's Cup squad, with an intensive 18-month trials process, comprising on-water and simulator-based analysis, used to assess the hopefuls' abilities to adapt to the unique skill set required to sail the AC40s. The selected twelve, form a strong sailing squad and have been getting the hours in on the water in Barcelona, upskilling alongside the senior British America's Cup team, ensuring a comprehensive skill enhancement program. The team will be supported in this challenge by leading global aerospace and maritime technology innovator Cobham-Ultra, in a continuation of the firm's extensive investment in UK engineering skills. •

THE FUTURE STARS OF THE AMERICA'S CUP

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE YOUTH AMERICA'S CUP

Developing pathways into the America's Cup is a challenge that has been faced down since 2013 when the inaugural Red Bull Youth America's Cup was introduced in San Francisco and the winners of that regatta are today the leading names in our sport.

Peter Burling, today the skipper of the Defender of the Louis Vuitton 37th America's Cup, skippered the 'NZL Sailing Team with Emirates Team New Zealand' that featured stellar names like Blair Tuke, Andy Maloney and Sam Meech who are all involved with Emirates Team New Zealand in 2024. Other names in that regatta, which was then held in non-foiling AC45 catamarans, include Jason Saunders (now with Orient Express Racing Team), Lucien Cujean and Jason Waterhouse (both now with Alinghi Red Bull Racing).

Following the success of that inaugural regatta, the Red Bull Youth America's Cup returned in 2017 in the crystal waters of Bermuda with the upgraded AC45F foiling catamaran and this time it was the British 'GBR Land Rover BAR Academy' team that lifted the trophy. Onboard was Neil Hunter, the powerhouse cyclist who was quickly snapped up by the senior team and is now a key member of the INEOS Britannia squad.

Unfortunately, due to the global pandemic, the 2021 regatta didn't happen in Auckland but was revitalised by the sponsorship of UniCredit Bank to return in 2024 with the UniCredit Youth America's Cup in Barcelona. The regatta will take place from the 10th to the 26th September in fully-equalised AC40 foiling monohulls.

For certain the future stars of the America's Cup will be on display and the competition is set to be white-hot for the young guns hoping to make their mark on this fabulous event and begin their journey at the very apex of the sport.

AMERICA'S CUP TERMINOLOGY

GLOSSARY

BOAT TERMINOLOGY

HELM Two onboard either side of the AC40, steer the boat.

FLIGHT CONTROLLERS/TRIMMERS Two onboard the AC40—control the ride height of the boat out of the water and the trim of the mainsail and jib.

FCS The Foil Cant System is the electronic mechanism on the AC40 that lifts and raises the foil arms in and out of the water.

FOILS The wing-like structures at the end of the foil arms that allow the boat to lift out of the water and keep the hull 'flying' clear of the surface.

MAST ROTATION The AC40 has the ability to rotate the mast a few degrees either into or away from the wind direction for better aerodynamics.

RUDDER The fin at the back of the boat that the helmsman uses to change the direction of the boat. The rudder also has an 'elevator' wing at its base which gives the boat lift and stability in flight.

RACE COMMITTEE The Regatta Director and any other person performing a race committee function.

RACING RULE / RRS The Racing Rules of Sailing. For the America's Cup, the Racing Rules are adapted for the specifics of the competition and make allowances and detailed rules for racing the AC40 class of boats.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS/SI For the UniCredit Youth America's Cup and the Puig Women's America's Cup, Sailing Instructions are fully defined in the published **Protocol** and further clarified as 'Race Conditions'.

DEFINITIONS

ABANDON To abandon a race means to stop racing and not score the race.

BOUNDARY The line that marks the limits of the racing area as designated via the Race Officer (RO) Comms.

CAPSIZING A boat is capsized when her masthead is in the water.

CLEAR ASTERN AND CLEAR AHEAD; OVERLAP

One boat is clear astern of another when her platform border is behind a line abeam from the aftermost point of the other boat's media post. The other boat is clear ahead. They overlap when neither is clear astern. However, they also overlap when a boat between them overlaps both.

FINISH A boat finishes when after being completely on the course side, any part of its platform border crosses the finishing line from the course side after completing any penalties.

LEEWARD AND WINDWARD A boat's leeward side is the side that is or, when she is head to wind, was away from the wind. The other side is her windward side. When two boats on the same tack overlap, the boat on the leeward side of the other is the leeward boat. The other is the windward boat.

MARK An object the sailing instructions require a boat to leave on a specified side, a race committee vessel surrounded by navigable water from which the starting or finishing line extends, and an object intentionally attached to the object or vessel. However, an anchor line is not part of the mark.

MARK-ROOM Room for a boat to sail no farther from the mark than needed to sail her proper course to round or pass the mark, and room to pass a finishing mark after finishing.

OBSTRUCTION An object that a boat could not pass without changing course substantially, if she were sailing directly towards it and one of her hull lengths from it. An object that can be safely passed on only one side, a boundary, and any object, area or line so designated by a rule are also obstructions.

OCS A boat is OCS when at her starting signal any part of her platform border is determined at that time to be on the course side of the starting line or one of its extensions.

POSTPONE A postponed race is a race delayed before its scheduled start but may be started or abandoned later.

PROPER COURSE A course a boat would choose in order to sail to the next mark, or finish, on the leg they believe they are on as soon as possible in the absence of the other boats referred to in the rule using the term. A boat has no proper course before her starting signal.

PROTEST An allegation made under rule 61.2 by a boat, the Regatta Director or the Jury that a boat has broken a rule.

RACING A boat is racing from her preparatory signal until she finishes and clears the finishing line and marks or retires, or until the race committee signals that racing is stopped.

RO COMMS The communication system(s) provided by race management for boats and race officials when on the water.

TACK, STARBOARD OR PORT A boat is on the tack, starboard or port, corresponding to her windward side.
